Crest's 67th Annual July 4th Event!

Are you going to be in the parade? The parade will step off promptly at 9:00 am. If you are planning on being a participant, be down at South Lane Park by 8:00 to get ready to line up. This year all parade participants riding in floats, on horses, or in motorized vehicles must sign a waiver. This will take care of our insurance requirements and also help the judges in Nancy Jane Park identify you. If you have not already completed the form, print this out and bring it with you to the parade. Remember kids, your parents must sign the waiver for you to be in the parade.

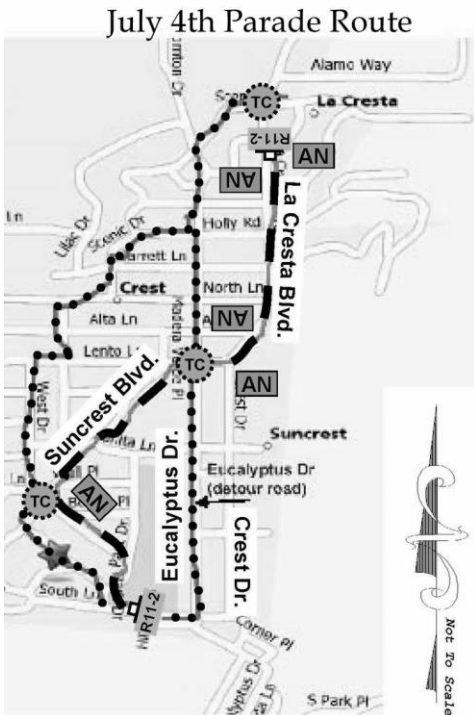
More parade information: The main road, La Cresta, will be closed in the morning to through traffic for approximately 45 minutes until the last parade participant passes. **Going to watch the parade?** The parade starts at South Lane Park, moves north on Albatross to Suncrest / La Cresta, ending just past Nancy Jane Park on Scenic Drive. North Park Drive (street where clubhouse is located) will be closed to all traffic.

An alternate route will be flagged to get to the South side of Crest. If there is an emergency, volunteers will radio the command center and we will deal with it. The official road closures throughout the parade route may occur from 8:30 – 10:30. Roads will open as the parade passes.

All parade participants need to show up at 8:00 am. Signs will be posted to direct you to the appropriate staging area. All motorcycles need to stay in a group due to safety issues! **Please do not pass the fire engines!**

We hope to see your tractors, antique cars, golf carts, horses, marching bands, and floats. Note on map, the dashed line shows the actual parade route. The dotted line shows the alternative route to be used during road closures.

Music starts at Nancy Jane Park at 8:00 am and continues until 1:00 pm. Remember to bring money for hot dogs, burgers, nachos, drinks, raffle tickets, CCA membership, and vendor goodies.

Are you paying too much tax?

Did you know that Crest is not listed on the tax-rate

tables under San Diego County or the City of El Cajon? Being in the unincorporated area of Crest with a zip code of 92021, our tax rate is 8%. However, because the general postal zip code of 92021 is shared with El Cajon City, we are typically charged 9% , the El Cajon City rate.

While this doesn't seem like a big deal and there aren't many businesses in Crest, the 1% can sometimes be substantial when having large purchases delivered to your home or when purchasing a vehicle.

In an effort to clarify the subject, Crest resident Kathy Fiedor inquired and received a letter from the El Cajon City Manager's office stating the current sales tax in El Cajon 9% but the sales tax rate at Kathy's address in Crest is 8%. She stated it is not always possible to determine the correct tax rate based on the post office zip code

If you are planning on making a large purchase, you can call (619) 441-1716 **Teresa Bussey** or email tbussey@cityofelcajon.us with your specific address and she will be happy to write an email or letter specifically verifying your name and address and stating that your tax rate is 8%. You can then take this letter with you to the store as verification of your correct tax rate. 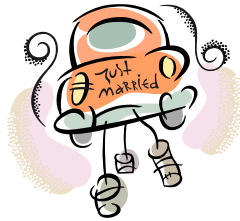

Mike Garcia Honored

Long time Crest resident, Mike Garcia is one of 90 Southern California veterans recently honored with a trip to Washington, DC over the Memorial Day weekend. Sponsored by the nonprofit group Honor Flight, the purpose of this trip was to thank Mike for his World War II service. Mike's youngest son, David accompanied his dad as "Guardian" on this emotional and heartwarming journey.

Mike shared, "From the departure at Lindbergh Airport to our return home, the trip was incredible. Wherever we went we were treated like heroes with people coming up

to us thanking us for our service. Boy Scouts, servicemen, and visitors alike lined up at the many receptions to shake our hands and to talk with us." The honorees were taken on a ten hour tour of the Washington DC monuments, including the Lincoln Memorial, Arlington National Cemetery and the National World War II Memorial. "I can't tell you how fantastic the people were. In one spot, we looked down and there were over 200 people awaiting our arrival." Every detail of the trip from the name tags to the t-shirts, from the flight attendants to the motorcade escorts spelled patriotism and thanks! Their plane was even greeted with an honor water salute (the plane travels under plumes of water expelled by fire fighting vehicles.) Arriving back at Lindberg field, they were welcomed by active-duty sailors and Marines in uniform forming a reception line which stretched several hundred feet from the bottom of the escalator past three baggage carousels. Music blared from speakers, Boy Scouts saluted, and dancers performed the jitterbug.

Mike stated, "I've travelled a lot over the years and visited six world capitols, but never had an opportunity to visit our own capitol. It was the best trip ever! I am proud to have been selected for this honor."

The trip was sponsored by Honor Flight, a non-profit group that give special thanks to our most senior WWII veterans for their dedication and commitment to protecting the freedoms enjoyed by so many citizens of our greatest nation. The San Diego chapter chartered the plane and sponsored this trip funded entirely through donations. Mike joined the U.S. Army Air Corp in 1941. In 1943 he was sent overseas to England where he was assigned to the 475th Sub Depot where they had the responsibility of repairing and returning battle damaged B-17's and B-24's back into action. He remained on assignment until war's end.

Mike was a volunteer for the Crest Volunteer Fire Department from 1951 to the late '60s, extinguishing many, many fires. Active in the Crest PTA, Mike was awarded the second life-time membership. He was involved in the local Catholic Church and in 1971 Mike began a 10 year service stint on the Crest Water Board. He also formed a small VFW Post in Crest, the Lt Denny Sherman Post. Mike was also a member of the Flying Samaritans and a member of the El Cajon Elks Lodge 1812.

In addition to raising two fine boys, Mary owned a beauty shop for five years from 1965 to 1970. Additionally, Mary was a member of Women's Fire Auxiliary, the Crest Observation Corp, the Crest Hix Mixers Square Dance Club, and was a board member and charter member of Crest School's first PTA.

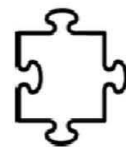
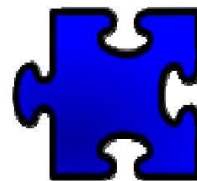
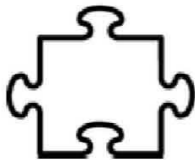

Thank You Dub Moore

Imagine my surprise to learn that W.C “Dub” Moore, a 28 year Crest resident and World War II veteran, also travelled on the “Tour of Honor” to Washington DC sponsored by Honor Flights San Diego. It is, indeed, an honor to have two such distinguished veterans on the Crest Hill.

Traveling with a marine volunteer, Dub met up with his niece and her husband, Debbie and Brian



Wadosky in Washington, D.C. They accompanied Dub to the festivities throughout the Memorial Day weekend planned to honor our World War II veterans. “The trip was very impressive and well organized, relays Dub. From the flight to Washington to the tour of the monuments, it ran perfectly.” There were so many details into making this a momentous trip such as a mail call in flight where they were given letters written by relatives, friends and students thanking them for their service. Two of Dubs children, Terri Moore and Mary Kuchenbecker even came in from out of town to meet the flight. One of Dub’s favorite experiences was his visit to the hill overlooking the monuments and the Pentagon. “You could even see where the plane hit the pentagon on 9/11.” Another memory he won’t soon forget was the World War II Memorial Wall of Stars, a field of 4,000 sculpted gold stars on the Freedom Wall. This wall commemorates the more than 400,000 Americans who gave their lives. During WWII, the gold star was the symbol of family sacrifice.

Dub entered the Marines in 1943 when he was just 17 years old. After training in San Diego, he soon found himself in Guadalcanal and Bougainville after the major fighting was over. He was then sent to Okinawa, Japan. He stayed there until the Japanese surrendered. One of his memories before landing on Okinawa was they were told that the island had more poisonous snakes per square mile than any place in the world; this got their attention. The fact is, he never saw a snake during his time there.

After the Japanese surrendered, Dub was sent to Tientsin, China where he worked to help rehabilitate interned allied civilians in China before they could be sent home. In China, there were challenges to overcome; after being in the tropics, the marines did not have warm enough clothes as they arrived during the winter. Another challenge he remembers was being stationed in an old walled British military post where nothing worked and they couldn’t get any parts. On a lighter note, they were not allowed to have any alcohol brought inside the gates. That didn’t stop them from tossing the beer over the walls! It was old China and he had memories of not seeing women on the streets as was the tradition back then. He has made two trips back to China since to see the many changes.

Dub and his wife Norma have lived in Crest since 1988. After leaving the military, Dub returned to St Joseph, Missouri, but eventually found he was attracted to the warm San Diego weather he remembered while being stationed here. He spent several years working in the theaters, most memorable the Balboa Theatre where he was the manager. After TV became popular, the popularity of the theatres died away and he changed careers one more time. For thirty-five years, Dub worked for the Automobile Club of CA before retiring to the good life in Crest.

San Miguel Fire Protection District News

San Miguel Votes to Increase Fire Taxes

At the June 12, 2013 San Miguel Fire Protection District Board Meeting, resolutions were passed increasing our current fire protection taxes. Below shows the history of these taxes and increases that are effective July 1, 2013.

CREST SPECIAL BENEFIT TAX

The Fire Suppression and Emergency Services Special Benefit Tax for the Crest area (the "Crest Special Benefit Tax") was created after a special election held on April 8, 1980 which received a majority of votes, within the boundaries of the original Crest Fire Protection District in the community of Crest. The purpose of the Crest Special Benefit Tax is to fund operating expenses, capital improvements expenditures and debt repayment in order to provide local fire suppression and emergency services.

Resolution 13-5 0% Increase

A Resolution of the Board of Directors of the San Miguel Consolidated Fire Protection District Ordering the Levy of the Special Benefit Tax for Fire Suppression and Emergency Services (Crest Area) for Fiscal Year 2013/2014 (editor's note: This resolution was just a formality since the Crest Special Benefit tax does not have a provision for annual rate adjustments; therefore the figure remains the same.)

PARAMEDIC SPECIAL BENEFIT TAX

The Special Benefit Tax for the Provision of Advanced Life Support (Paramedic/Firefighter) Engines (the "Paramedic Special Benefit Tax") was approved within the entire boundary of the East County Fire Protection District at the general election held on November 5, 2002. The measure received a 71.5% support. The purpose of the Paramedic Special Benefit Tax is to provide paramedic / firefighters to provide advanced life support (paramedic) service

Resolution 13-7 – 1.60% Increase

Cal-Fire vs San Miguel...

What's Up?

Leonard Villarreal, Public Information Officer for San Miguel addresses the changes that have taken place since San Miguel has contracted out fire services to Cal Fire.

What remains the same:

The San Miguel Fire District remains intact. The District owns all assets including building, real estate, and equipment. The Board of Directors still governs, sets policy and manages the budget.

What has changed:

The San Miguel Fire District entered into a Cooperative Agreement with CAL FIRE. As a result our Firefighters shifted employment from the District to the State (CAL FIRE). For the most part this started with the same people, with the same experience working at the same Stations, only wearing a different patch. Over time as people transfer, promote or leave, there will be a greater blending of the crews.

This was an emotional transition, but the changing times and relentless economy provided little wiggle room. It is anticipated this cooperative agreement will reduce District expenses by millions of dollars, and allow the District to plan for the projected and expensive future increases in needed services. More people, more Baby Boomers needing more help.

The greatest share of the savings comes from the fact that while working for San Miguel Firefighters worked a 56 hour week, now under CAL FIRE Firefighters work a 72 hour week. More hours, for basically the same compensation. In addition, the longer week reduces the District's need to pay overtime.

The transition that began at 8AM on December 31, 2012, has gone well. The Board will continue to monitor CAL FIRE compliance with the Agreement to make sure, all metrics in terms of response and service remain at or better than the pre-agreement era.

Cited party hosts often charged, panel finds

Adult party hosts be warned. With graduations under way and summer approaching, sheriff's deputies plan to step up enforcement of social host laws in the cities and communities they patrol. City police departments also are expected to continue citing violators of the local laws that hold adults criminally liable for knowingly hosting gatherings where those under 21 are drinking alcohol. Penalties vary, but some cases can draw a misdemeanor criminal conviction, fines of more than \$1,000 and probation. The county and all 18 cities in the county have some sort of social host law on the books. The Sheriff's Department has made a special effort to enforce the laws.

On average, deputies issued five tickets a month in the first half of 2012 — up from less than two tickets a month for each of the previous three years, according to the Alcohol Policy Panel, a volunteer coalition that advises county officials on ways to end binge and underage drinking. Of the 30 tickets issued, about three-quarters of the cases ended up in court. And most of the defendants ended up with a conviction, the panel's research found. "I find that encouraging," said Beth Sise, chairwoman of the Alcohol Policy Panel.

The point is to prevent drunken driving, sexual assaults or any harm that can follow when teens and alcohol mix, even if the party is at mom and dad's house, said Lt. Christina Bavencoff of the San Marcos sheriff's station.

"People are allowed to have parties. We just want people to think twice before something bad happens," Bavencoff said.

The Sheriff's Department issued 84 social host citations between Jan. 1, 2008, and April 30, 2012, according to data compiled by the Center for Community Research, a San Diego nonprofit that provides research and evaluation services.

Nearly half of those — 35 citations — were from Vista. In recent years, police departments in the county have issued 207 citations for violating social host ordinances.

The mission of the sub-regional planning group is to advise and assist the Director of Planning, the Planning and Environmental Review Board, the Zoning Administrator, the Planning Commission and the Board of Supervisors in the preparation, amendment and implementation of community and sub-regional plans.

Meetings are held the 2nd Monday of each month at 7:00 pm. Locations rotate between the Dehesa School, The Crest Community Center, and the Harbison Canyon Community Center. F. ACTION ITEMS.

1. Discussion and action on the proposed consolidation of Rural Fire and the County Fire Authority. Planning Group member Mary Manning opened the discussion about the proposed consolidation of the Rural Fire Protection District and the County Fire Authority. She distributed copies of an article from East County Magazine reporting about the 8 May 2013 meeting of the Rural Fire Protection District Board, copies of a letter sent to the community from the District Board, and also copies of a personal letter that she wrote in response to the District Board's letter to the community. Summarizing the situation, she explained that the County is not willing to continue providing funds to the Rural Fire Protection District beyond June 2014, and wants the District to agree to a one-year extension of the current contract with Cal-Fire on the condition that the District agrees to its dissolution by the Local Agency Formation Commission, with the District's responsibilities and services being transferred to the jurisdiction of the County Fire Authority. The District could reject the County's proposal and remain independent, but it would then not have sufficient funding after June 2014 to maintain professionally staffed fire stations in Harbison Canyon, Dehesa and elsewhere, and would also have to raise special assessments within the District from \$100 per household to \$450-\$500 per household despite closing several fire stations and only keeping open the stations in Jamul and Otay. Mary Manning pointed out that if the District refused the County's proposal, staffing at the fire stations in Harbison Canyon and Dehesa would revert to the volunteer staffing levels of 2006, the FEMA funds that have been allocated for construction of sleeping quarters at the Harbison Canyon station could be lost, and the improved ISO ratings allowing for better fire insurance ratings in the community (based on fully staffed fire stations and the recently installed hydrants) would also be jeopardized. Mary moved that the Planning Group writes a letter to the County and District that states the communities in the Subregion want to maintain the current (or better) staffing of their fire stations, with professional paid staff, and with Harbison Canyon and Dehesa fire stations maintained at their current budget levels; with the stations' current abilities to fight fires maintained in order to continue homeowners' opportunities to obtain fire insurance; and with better lines of communication and a simplified command structure regarding contacts between community fire stations and administrative authorities. Before a vote on the motion the Group discussed possible problems that might be associated with an independent District, or with a consolidated County Fire Authority; if the Harbison Canyon and Dehesa stations could be removed from the District (should it seek independence) and join the County Fire Authority; and also that the Group would not be able to prepare an adequately informed letter to the District and County Fire Authority prior to the 4 June submission date. Wally Riggs suggested an alternative action whereby the Group sends an email to Supervisor Jacob requesting her views about how the Subregion and its fire stations would be affected if 1) the Rural Fire Protection District is dissolved, 2) if the District becomes independent; and specifically, how the Harbison Canyon and Dehesa fire stations can best be maintained at their current or better levels of staffing and service. Mary Manning withdrew her original motion. She then moved that the Group writes a letter addressed to Supervisor Jacob, and Kenneth Miller, Herman Reddick and Susan Casarano of the County Fire Authority, recommending that the Rural Fire Protection District is dissolved and its responsibilities and services are merged and consolidated with the County Fire Authority, because without protection provided by CFA there will be effectively no local fire protection at all in the communities of the Subregion. The motion passed (10 yes; 0 no; 0 abstain).

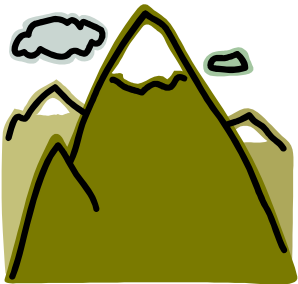

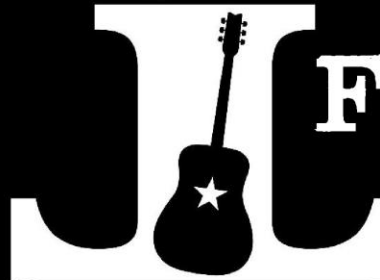

CREST FIRE SAFE COUNCIL:

As many of you know a call went out from the Crest Emergency Call System (OneCall Now) to 1,727 phones of Crest residents informing them about the smoke that was approaching Crest. It turned out to be a fire off of Santo Road along Highway 52, or Mission Trails Park. Thanks to a resident who was concerned about the smoke, we were able to research the fire and send out the message. CFSC has had residents let us know they want to be informed about any large fire and definitely smoke. So as we research events, we use the email system and calls to keep you informed as much as possible. Thanks to many of you, we have raised just over \$500.00. We need \$700.00 to purchase 10,000 calls. As you can see, an informational call takes almost 2,000 calls. If we were to have an incident, the 10,000 calls would go very quickly. With that said, the Crest Emergency Call System is implemented when it appears Crest is in danger. Unfortunately, we do not have the resources to inform you about every wildfire as each callout costs around \$100.

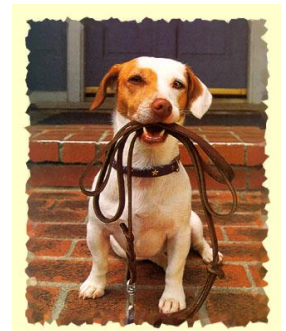
