#### Sheriff's Holiday Watch Tips: Let's Talk Turkey!

"Over the mountains and through the woods, to grandmother's house we go." Thanksgiving comes to mind every time I sing this to my grandkids. But it is also the time when busy people become vulnerable to crime. Even though you are rushed and thinking about a thousand things, we urge you to stay alert. Criminals do not take a holiday and look for opportunities to victimize you!

Travel safety and prevention tips have taken on a new meaning during tough economic times. Opportunistic thieves may be looking for unprotected homes or pre-occupied travelers. Thanksgiving is the busiest travel season of the year. **Safety begins at home** 

- Make sure your house looks "lived-in" when you are away.
- · Lock all doors and windows, set household lights on timers.
- Trim your hedges/bushes so thieves cannot have a place to hide. Have a neighbor park a car in your driveway to make it appear as if someone is home.

- If you have an alarm system, use it to control access points.
- Ask a trusted neighbor or friend to watch your house.

#### Watch out for clever criminals

- Do not stop if your car is bumped from behind or if someone says there is something wrong with your car.
- Go to a well-lit, populated area and call for help.
- Fill the gas tank before dark. If alone, lock your doors when you leave to fill the gas tank.
- Upon destination arrival, remove valuables from your car/lock the doors.

#### Safety away from home

- Carry money separately from credit cards.
- Do not overburden yourself with packages to avoid being an easy target.
- · Stick to well-lighted and well-traveled streets at all times.
- Select ATM machines in visible, well-lighted locations.
- Do not leave valuables in your hotel room. Most hotels have safes for quest use.
- Keep your hotel room door locked, even when you are inside.
   Having timers for your lamps is a great crime prevention tip,
   indicating that someone is home, even though you are just
   getting off work.

In the next few weeks, Crime Prevention, Sheriff's Senior Volunteers and Deputies will be implementing our annual "Holiday Watch" program. This provides the communities we serve with enhanced crime prevention information and additional patrols. This is a county wide Sheriff's assignment for our law enforcement and professional staff.

Neighborhood Watch and or Business Watch signs and Reporting Suspicious Activity are two key ingredients to keeping the criminal element aware we are in partnership and eyes are watching! We would encourage neighbors get together and purchase a Neighborhood Watch Sign. Sharing the cost of a \$25 - \$50 Neighborhood Watch Sign is one way we can let the bad guys know to "stay out!" 

#### Saturday November 17, 2012, 9:00am-1:00pm: Cactus Monitoring on the San Diego National Wildlife Refuge

Join refuge staff to make important observations about Coastal cactus wrens. Cactus wrens are fairly common in the desert, however, in coastal Southern California they are declining because they rely on a rare habitat type cactus scrub especially prickly pear and cholla for nesting, foraging, and protection. Unlike most other birds, cactus wrens use nests year round for roosting (sleeping); they build a covered, footballshaped nest with grasses and other vegetation. The small populations of coastal cactus wren in Southern California are becoming more and more isolated from each other because of habitat loss and fragmentation due to urbanization and wildfire. Active restoration is underway on the San Diego National Wildlife Refuge to accelerate habitat recovery for the coastal cactus wren.

Guided by refuge biologist, John Martin, volunteers will visit the restoration sites to observe and record the condition of the cactus, the wrens, and any invasive plants or animals. Wear long pants, a hat, and sturdy shoes. Bring sunscreen or rain protection, as the weather indicates. Bring water and a water bottle if you have one. Tools, equipment, water and snacks will be provided. We are happy to sign for community service or extra credit hours.
