One Call Now:

The CFSC volunteers are finally caught up with all of the "OneCall Now" entries from the 4th of July. Thank you so much for checking in, making changes, and introducing yourself. Remember, this is your system, we are here for you. Invite a new neighbor to join or if you forgot to sign up for the call system or email system, it is not too late. It is free. Send your information to <u>KathyFiedor@gmail.com</u> and you will be entered into the system to be notified of emergency and community information.

Fire Prevention Product Demonstration

Somehow at the 4th, CFSC got so busy that they neglected to share the contents of the little black Fire and Ice trailer parked in front of the clubhouse. The trailer contained a fire prevention product which they planned to demonstrate. Kandhy Franklin shared, "It is granules that can be activated with water spray to be used on your house, lawn, car, trees and some farm animals in the event of a fire. The cost for these packages is roughly \$1,200 for a 1,400 square foot home. The granules have a shelf life of 7 years and can easily be washed off your home with water. I recently volunteered to be a "guinea pig" at a demonstration of this product, I had my arm covered with the chemical, and then lit with a torch. Nothing happened and I hardly felt any heat. Then I tasted it. Yuck-but I am still here. The trailer is still on the hill and there is a plan to bring it to future town hall meeting so residents can see it and try it out. I am in the process of writing a grant for members of the community who live on the canvons or have preserve or untreated land surrounding their home. As we seem to always be in this fire season, I am trying to find grants for fuel reduction, and ideas to keep us safe."

Sign Up if You Have a Need or Service

From time to time I get requests from our Crest residents to put out an email for anyone who wants to house sit, do animal care, garden work, house cleaning, grading, music or other services. If you would like, I would be willing to add your name in the CFSC notebook of contacts.

Additionally, I have folks who need to checked on in the event of an evacuation as well as residents on oxygen and other special needs. Do you Have Defensible Space?

Please be advised that Crest will be a target area again for non-compliance of fuel reduction. It is very expensive to be fined for not reducing your fuel load. If you are notified to clean up your property, please take this notice seriously. There is still a small amount of grant money to assist with removing fuel for widows, elderly, and shut-ins. Upcoming Emergency Evacuation Summit Meeting for Community Members

Crest Fire Safe Council is in the process of establishing a date for an **Emergency Evacuation Summit** for the Crest Community at the Crest clubhouse. Watch the blackboard for the date and time. The purpose of this meeting is to allow agencies and community members have input for the conceptual planning and implementation of a plan in the event of an emergency. This seminar will discuss evacuation routes, as well as develop a procedure and policy for the implementation of these routes. Each agency as well as the public has an opportunity to express and list their concerns and goals. This will be an opportunity to share our public concerns.

Crest fire Safe Council (CFSC) Receives San Diego Gas and Electric Grant

Thanks to SDG&E for awarding CFSC with a \$2,500 grant for communications and enhancements.

In past years, similar grants were received. The last grant was used to purchase a repeater to be placed on our local mountain to be used by Ham Radio Groups and other emergency communication groups. Previous grants were used for 1) our One Call Now Emergency call system, 2) evacuation signs which will be used to announce evacuation routes, and 3) for our Crest Siren, which is located behind the Crest Clubhouse.

The grant this year will be used to make needed improvements to the Crest Community building. CFSC

will be ordering storage racks to hold folding chairs and tables. Round tables will also be ordered and will be utilize in the clubhouse for our Incident Command Center. An added benefit is that these items will be available for CCA events such as music nights, and



other community events. The photo pictured above is an example of the rack which will be purchased for the rectangle tables and chairs; a similar rack will be ordered for the round tables.

AB 1965 Passes – Dogs now legally allowed in restaurants if seated in the outdoor patio areas. However, restaurant policy still prevails. Signed into law August 21, 2014, businesses who wish to accommodate diners with dogs are now safe from being unnecessarily cited. Restaurants must have an outdoor entrance to the patio and the dogs obviously must leashed and well behaved.







A Little About Our Neighbors: John Steward Harbison - Harbison Canyon (From Wikipedia) In the spring of 1874 John Harbison moved with his wife and daughter to a homestead near the Sweetwater River east of San Diego in a little valley now known as *Harbison Canyon*. Within seven years' time, he was the largest producer of honey in the world, operating 2000 to 3000 hives. At that time, having several hundred hives was considered a large operation, His success in capitalizing on the vast honey potential of San Diego County, along with his extensive campaign of selling bees to the residents of the county was the major force in making San Diego County the greatest honey producing county in the State of California by 1874, which in turn made California the leading honey producing state of the Union. John Harbison was a major contributor to the theory of bee culture with his development of new tools and methods that characterized the remarkable advances made in nineteenth century apicultural science. He opened up the great retail markets east of the Mississippi River needed to absorb the tremendous honey crops produced in California. John Harbison was worthy of the title bestowed upon him by members of the bee industry-"King of the Beekeepers." He died October 12, 1912, in San Diego at the age of eighty-six. New Bike-Passing Law

California's Three-Feet-For Safety Act takes effect September 16. The law requires motorists to give bicyclists at least 3 feet of clearance when passing. If traffic or road conditions prevent this, drivers must "slow to a speed that is reasonable and prudent" and pass only when safe to do so without endangering the bicyclist. 
The mission of the sub-regional planning group is to advise and assist the Director of Planning, the Planning and Environmental Review Board, the Zoning Administrator,

the Planning Commission and the Board of Supervisors in the preparation, amendment and implementation of community and sub-regional plans.

Meetings are held the 2nd Monday of each month at 7:00 pm. Locations rotate between the Dehesa School, The Crest Community Center, and the Harbison Canyon Community Center. The June 9 meeting will be held at the DEHESA SCHOOL, 4612 Dehesa Road, El Cajon, 92019. The following are excerpts from the June 9 minutes pertaining to Crest:

F. ACTION ITEMS. Road maintenance priority in Plan area. Chairman Riggs reported that he received a letter from the County requesting that the Group provides its input concerning the prioritization of repairs to public County roads in all 4 areas of the Subregion. He shared with the Group the spreadsheet of County recommendations for road segments in all areas, and a map, that accompanied the letter. The Group discussed a number of the current County priority recommendations. Phil Hertel volunteered to check the road conditions, according to spreadsheet segments, for the Crest area. He also volunteered to scan the County's road list document and send it out to all the Planning Group members. Chairman Riggs said he would put this item on the agenda of the July meeting as an Action Item topic.

G1. Announcements and correspondence. Mary Manning announced that on 6 June the Rural Fire Protection District Board voted (4-0-0) to approve the Draft Dissolution; Director Russo recused himself, sat in the audience, and refused to vote. The approved Draft Dissolution will now be submitted to LAFCO for its consideration and decision. Unless 2,250 legally registered residents of the Rural Fire Protection District vote to stop dissolution by 30 June, it will automatically occur following LAFCO approval, and the County will be the receiver, acquiring all of the debts and benefits of the RFPD. If 2,250 valid signatures protesting the dissolution are in fact secured before 30 June, then there would need to be a public vote about the dissolution proposal.





A New Friend, Father Ben

I've always thought that the next best thing to traveling is to actually meet someone from an "exotic" faraway place (in this case, Kenya) who has made the long journey here to Crest. This summer it was

my pleasure to spend a few hours with a young Catholic priest who was filling in at St. Louise for Father Burnia. In Kenya he is Father Kanda, but here he goes by the name "Father Ben" to make it easy for us to remember. Fr. Ben was born in a small village in Kenya called Chesongoch. When he was only 3 yr. old his father died, leaving his loving mother to raise him and his 4 brothers. Times were tough as the family had no source of income - his mother turned to the Catholic nuns and the church for help. She cooked and kept house for the nuns who paid her with food so she and the boys had something to eat. A kindly priest took the boy under his wings, sponsored his schooling and seminary, and inspired Kanda to become a "good man, like the priest," Fr. Ben relates. These days, Fr. Ben lives with two other priests who serve the community in the village of Turbo, a 6 hr. drive from Nairobi. Turbo has a population roughly the size of Crest.

I wondered what life is like in his remote village. Father explained that the people are very poor - they have no cars, or electricity - so no lights, refrigerators, stoves, or televisions. There are only about ten business buildings including a little store and post office. Villagers go about an hour to the town of Eldoret to buy clothes. Water for drinking, cooking, washing clothes, and bathing is collected at the river nearby. Children attend school for free just through primary grades where they are taught in English because of the large number of regional dialects. The family or a sponsor must pay for high school for the children so many do not attend. Before school each day the girls need to gather wood for a cooking fire, go to the river for water, and do domestic work with their mothers. Men never cook or work in the kitchen. They engage in pastoral farming while the boys tend to the animals (usually chickens, goats, sheep, and/or cattle) and help with the farm chores. No matter how poor, the villagers never ask if you need something - they merely share what they have with others, including offerings of food to the priests at each Sunday Mass.

Fr. Ben was excited to leave Kenya for the first time, take his first plane ride, and see our little village of Crest. Since arriving he's learned how to use some devices unfamiliar to him such as a microwave oven, vacuum, and can opener. (His village has no canned items since all food is prepared from scratch with fresh ingredients). So how do they prepare food back home? Women cook all meals in a pot resting on 3 stones and placed over the fire on the ground. A typical breakfast might consist of Kenyan tea, sweet potato, and bread, or perhaps leftovers from the night before since the food cannot be refrigerated. For lunch there might be ugali (corn flour boiled in water to a dough-like consistency), beans and Irish potatoes. These potatoes are brought to town, sometimes in a little truck, or at other times on the back of a donkey. Supper would be ugali with meat or vegetable stew, rice and beans.

"The people here have been very nice," Father says, and he "would love to stay even just another month to learn everyone's name" at St. Louise. Some have brought him meals or taken him shopping - yes, even to Costco - while others have shown him the sights and taken him on walks around Crest. He even had a chance to visit our Crest Library. Father's first splash ever in any ocean was at La Jolla Shores! Intrigued with the custom here to choose to walk to get our exercise, he explained it is not a health decision in his village - walking is the *only* way for most people to get around. Proudly wearing his new American flag t-shirt, Fr. Ben enjoyed our Crest 4th of July parade and festivities, marveling at all the flags and spirit.

Father really seemed to have been pleased with his visit to our little community and making new friends. His stay here came to a close on August 5th when he flew home to Kenya. I certainly appreciated meeting Father Ben who enriches us by sharing his



stories of Kenyan life. Perhaps we will see him again in the future!


